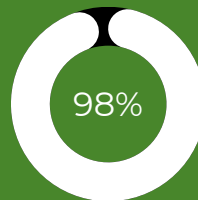
Commitment to Continuous Quality Improvement

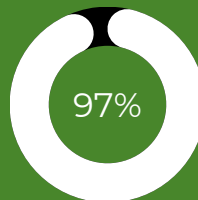

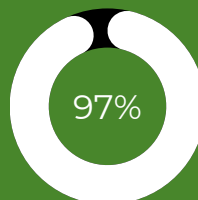
2023-24 Survey Results



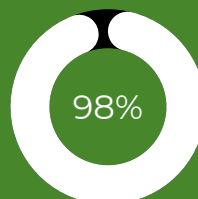

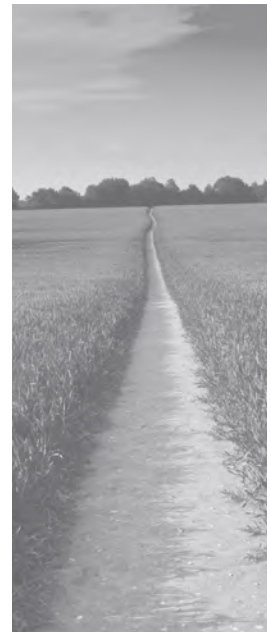

"I have never opened up before the way that I have opened up to my counsellor. They make me feel that I am in a very safe place and that for the first time ever there is no judgement. I was treated very poorly by two different psychiatrists in my life; trust is a hard thing for me. I will trust them with my life. They helped me find clarity that I have been searching for all of my life, but even more so for the last 21 years. I believe as things progress they are probably the key to helping me with the parts of myself that terrify me. They helped me to understand my emotions, and where they come from why I am having them. I am feeling the first real hope I have every child in my life concerning my mental health."

Strengthening People



Counselling Services

Community Counselling: This program offers counselling based on clients' needs, and operates on a sliding fee scale to ensure that nobody is turned away. Skilled counsellors work with clients on issues as diverse as grief, self-esteem, healthy relationships, parenting, coping and mental wellness.

Rapid Access Counselling (RAC) Clinics: These clinics provide single-session walk-in counselling at no charge for children, youth, caregivers, couples, and families. The goal of RAC is to help address the immediate needs of the client through brief solution-focused support. In-house clinics were offered at various locations throughout Saskatoon and surrounding communities.

fseap: The fseap program provides contracted counselling services to participating businesses. Employees within the program access individual and family counselling and a variety of wellness workshops.

Group Programs: Family Service Saskatoon provides groups and workshops designed to enhance the lives of individuals and families. Groups offered vary throughout the year depending on the needs of our clients and the community. Examples include: Depression and Anxiety, Invisible Scars, Grief & Loss, and Abuse & Beyond.

Youth Programs

52° North: This program focuses on increasing participant wellbeing, building healthy relationships, and strengthening family supports for youth who are at risk of engaging in violence in our community. The program goal is the prevention of youth violence, specifically cyberbullying, bullying and dating violence.



52° North in the Community: This year 52° North increased their community outreach activities, providing 91 school and community presentations on topics related to mental wellness for youth.

Youth Exposed to Violence: This program supports youth through individual and group counselling on issues such as mental health, violence, healthy relationships, and self-esteem.

Child and Youth Support Program: This program matches children connected to the Ministry of Social Services with Support Workers who provide social/recreational programming and emotional support for children and youth. The support workers continue to offer compassion and care in their commitment to helping youth in our community.

Individual and Therapeutic Group Counselling: A specialized team of skilled counsellors provides counselling services for youth ages 12-29. Group counselling sessions focus on common themes and challenges experienced by youth, while individual counselling sessions offer youth the opportunity to focus on their individual concerns.

Nurturing Relationships

Family Violence Prevention & Outreach

Domestic Violence Court (DVC) Caseworkers: DVC caseworkers ensure that victims of domestic violence are supported through the legal system process, providing court updates, trial support, reports to assess requests for changes to release conditions, advocacy, and referrals to other services.

Intimate Partner Violence Outreach Program: The program provides individuals affected by interpersonal violence a place to come for confidential individual counselling and support in a safe and secure environment. Services in this program are delivered free of charge and include individual counselling, safety planning, outreach, and group counselling programs.

Men's Working Group for Respectful Relationships: For men that want to end the cycle of violence in their relationship, this program offers support in establishing a culture of respect and safety in intimate relationships. The program is a sanctioned option of the Saskatoon Domestic Violence Court.

When Anger Gets in the Way of Parenting: This program is focused on helping parents explore anger, learn to cope with anger, understand how anger impacts their children, and learn alternative parenting skills.

Parenting Programs & Resources

Attach Parenting: This program focuses on rebuilding and strengthening attachment between parent and child through guided activities that enhance a parent's ability to understand their own and their child's thoughts/feelings and recognize how this impacts situations.

Teen & Young Parent Program: A program for parents under the age of 30 that includes family support and counselling, and liaises with schools, community-based organizations, and government ministries to promote parenting awareness and education.

Parent Drop-In Support Group: 52° North offers a monthly drop-in support group for parents to provide a supportive space in which parents can have open discussions about their teens and the challenges they may face in parenting.

Diversity and Inclusion

Family Service Saskatoon is committed to honouring Diversity and Inclusion within our agency, in our service delivery, and in the community. Our Diversity and Inclusion Committee provides leadership and recommendations for FSS to facilitate diversity and inclusion initiatives.

As part of our commitment to both professional development and Reconciliation, Family Service Saskatoon continues to act on the organization priorities identified during our organization-wide mapping exercise with the Truth and Reconciliation through Treaty Implementation (TRTI) team. We continue to explore opportunities to implement activities and staff development experiences that advance truth, reconciliation and Treaty implementation into our operations and programming. Together we seek to forge a path towards a new, shared future for our children and grandchildren involving four key elements:

- A shared understanding of our history
- Vibrant cultures and worldviews
- Systems that benefit us all
- Authentic relationships

Family Service Saskatoon Radio-thon for Mental Health

This year Family Service Saskatoon embarked on a bold new venture with the launch of a two-day radio-thon designed to shed light on the mental health crisis in our community and open critical conversations about intimate partner violence, mental health and resiliency.

In partnership with Saskatoon Media Group, 98 Cool, 600 CJWW and 92.1 The Bull, we produced 23 hours of on-air programming. Together we shared many enlightening conversations about anxiety & depression, relationships, parenting, intimate partner violence, grief & loss and the concerns of youth. We are very thankful to our stakeholders, including program participants, for sharing their stories of recovery and hope.

The event was held at The Mall at Lawson Heights and featured on-air interviews, workshops, wellness classes and a Rapid Access Counselling clinic. Thank you to our Radio-thon Sponsors: Scotia Wealth Management, an anonymous family foundation, Business Furnishings and SIGA.





Building for the Future

2023-24 Initiatives

Promoting Mental Wellness: Recognizing the current pressures faced by our community, Family Service Saskatoon will continue to offer enhanced programming focused on mental health and well-being. In partnership with Saskatoon Public and Catholic Schools and our community partners, we will offer both school and community-based learning modules focusing on mental wellness and resiliency.

Rapid Access Counselling: Family Service Saskatoon, and our partners through Family Service Saskatchewan, continue to expand upon the successful Rapid Access Counselling initiative with additional clinics serving children, youth and family caregivers. The on-line booking platform for clients allows people to search for the nearest available counselling locations, available times and modalities (phone, virtual or in-person), and book their sessions immediately. Support for individuals who have experienced the loss of a loved one to suicide: Individuals who have been impacted by suicide or a suicide attempt can access counselling supports and resources to aid in the healing process, alleviate grief and distress and address the potential risk of suicide among those profoundly affected by the event. Family Violence Prevention: We will continue to offer group programs and ongoing individual counselling focusing on the prevention of family violence through parent education, programs that foster safer family relationships and that respond to the needs of individuals who have experienced family violence. Counselling will assist individuals to address their family violence concerns and provide parents with tools to develop positive and effective parenting skills. Programs for parents, children and youth will also help build resiliency and enhance mental wellness through strengthening personal skills and enhancing family communication skills.

Sharing Circles: As a reflection of our ongoing commitment to reconciliation and cultural inclusion, traditional understandings of health, well-being and healing, including sharing circles and the medicine wheel, will continue to be integrated into group programs as appropriate.

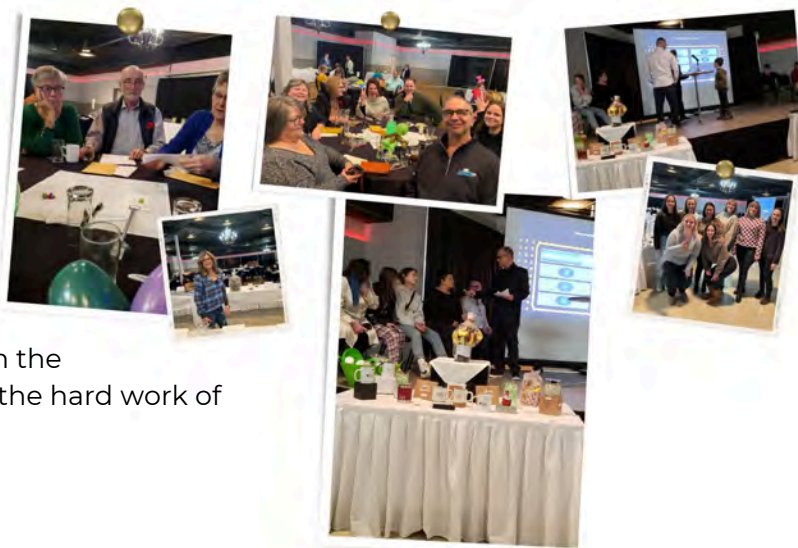


Semi Colon Heart Campaign

I have been a client of Family Service Saskatoon for over 4 years. I had initially walked in at my worst and [they] slowly helped me pick myself back up. The counsellor was very straight forward, honest and was very willing to pull me back up.

This journey has been less than ideal and definitely not pleasant, and my counsellor has been with me every step of the way. I struggle with boundaries for myself and staying focused on others when I should be focused on myself. Counselling has been able to show me that my needs and wants are just as important as anyone else's are. Each session my counsellor has pushed me to focus on myself and when I steer off into left field, I am quickly turned back. I knew this time, I was going to have to dig deep and share things that I did not even think I could. I am so used to burying everything. Counselling has helped me to unbury it and put it where it needs to be in my world. I will not lie, there were days I would leave feeling as if I was not getting it and I wasn't going to be able to get through it, but after, I would let the anxiety settle and truly hear the words; my anxiety would settle, and I was ready to keep taking baby steps forward.

I am beyond grateful for the direct and honest approach the counsellor has taken with me. I feel my counsellor has truly gotten me to see and understand how to continue to take baby steps forward in the right direction of this healing journey. I still have a long way to go, but I would not want to be doing this journey with anyone else. Family Service Saskatoon has truly helped me at my worst and while I still have my bad days with my mental health journey, I do not have any more "worst" day's and for that I am very grateful! I look forward to continuing this healing journey, being pushed to focus on what truly matters, myself and my children, and continue to be the best person and mother I know I am and can be!

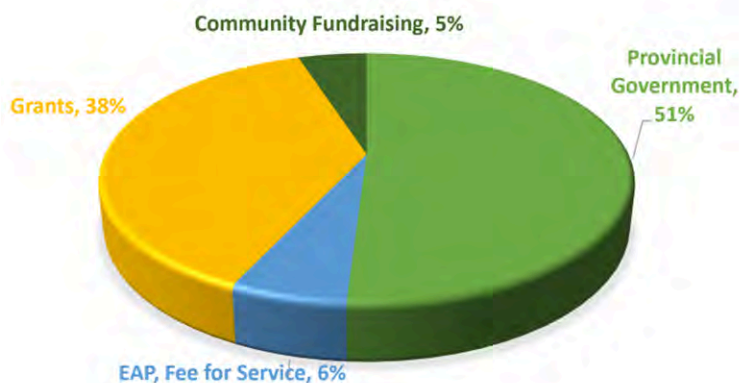

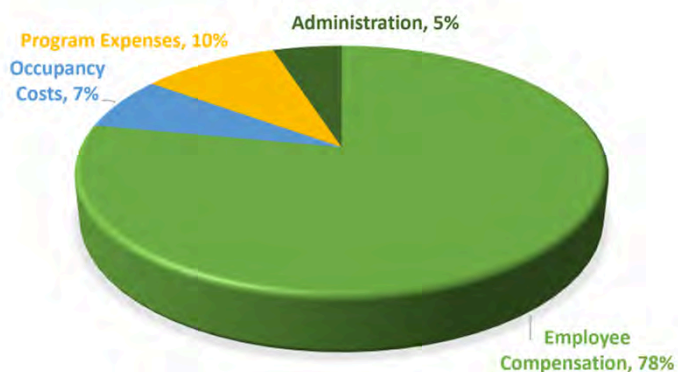
