







Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Outreach

This program offers support through short-term crisis intervention and counselling to individuals who are experiencing violence in their intimate partner relationships. Individual counselling, support groups and weekly drop-in groups are offered.

Wildflowers: IPV Drop-In Group

This is an open ongoing group for those who have or are currently experiencing violence in their intimate relationships. Each week will explore a different topic that focuses on the general experience of intimate partner violence and healing.

No registration or fees, childcare provided When: Tuesdays, 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm. <u>All genders</u> and Thursdays, 1:30 pm - 3:00 pm. <u>Women only.</u>

Redefining Intimacy

This group explores the sexual violence and intimate partner violence that survivors have experienced within their intimate relationships. This group will take place over an 8 week period and will provide safety for survivors to share their experiences, learn about healthy relationships, and redefine intimacy.

Men's Working Group for Respectful Relationships

This group is for men who want to end their intimate partner violence and build respectful relationships. The program offers 33 hours of therapeutic group work and meets every other Saturday over a 9-week period.

This 6 week group provides support and guidance to parents who have experienced IPV with a co-parent. Through discussion and activities, this group will explore power and control, boundaries, communication and safety, along with parenting techniques and skills.
